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Direct Certification

The Reauthorization Act of 2004 required that all LEAs in the National School Lunch Program implement direct certification. Direct certification simply means that children from families approved to receive food stamps or temporary assistance are automatically approved to receive free meals (for both breakfast and lunch) without having to complete an application. 2008-2009 Coordinated Review Effort (CRE) Results

During the 2008-2009 school year, the School Food Services Section conducted 143 CRE reviews. Eight of the Local Education Agencies (LEAs) did not meet Performance Standard 1, which evaluates student eligibility determinations and meal counting and claiming procedures for accuracy. All LEAs reviewed met Performance Standard 2, which evaluates meals on the day of review for meal component completeness. Please take extra care when determining student eligibility, meal counting and claiming, and monitoring meals for required components to ensure that the LEA is providing the State Agency with an accurate count of reimbursable free, reduced price and paid meals served.

As one of the final implementations of the Child Nutrition and WIC Reauthorization Act of 2004, the State Agency is required to conduct Additional Administrative Reviews (AARs) each year. During the 2008-2009 School Year, eight AARs were conducted. The districts selected were Hancock Place, Wellston, Mehlville R-IX, Willard R-II, Rolla 31, Reeds Spring R-IV, Carl Junction R-I, and Poplar Bluff R-I. All districts passed the review. Great job!

During the 2009-2010 school year, eight additional LEAs will be selected for an AAR. LEAs selected will be contacted soon.

Love Your Veggies

The makers of Hidden Valley® Salad Dressings are now accepting applications for the 2009-10 Love Your Veggies™ grant program. With support from its partner, the School Nutrition Foundation (SNF), the grant program will once again seek to help schools execute innovative programs that will increase the accessibility to and consumption of fresh fruits and vegetables in the lunchroom. Each grant award will support an elementary school in developing a program offering fresh vegetables and fruits through the 2010-2011 school year. Each school grant will consist of \$10,000 in direct funding.



Funding must be spent on any of the following:

- Fresh produce (vegetables and fruits)
- A vegetable station (such as a dedicated salad bar)
- Kitchen equipment (primary usage must relate to proposed program)
- Program staffing (cafeteria personnel, lunchroom staff, etc.)
- Nutrition education supplies
- Food safety training

Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program



The Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) provides all children in participating schools an opportunity to snack on fresh fruits and/or vegetables throughout the school day at no charge to

the children. During the 2008-09 school year, 11 LEAs with 55 buildings participated and received funding in the amount of \$933,278. During the 2009-2010 school year, 18 LEAs with 84 buildings are receiving funding in the amount of \$1,398,608. American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009

Public Law 111-5, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) was signed into law by President Obama on February 27. The ARRA provided a one-time appropriation of \$1.8 million for equipment assistance to school food authorities in the state of Missouri. ARRA grant funds were requested by 363 LEAs, with 26 LEAs approved. Grant funds were requested by 768 buildings, with 57 buildings approved. Requests were made for 2,426 pieces of equipment, with 198 pieces of equipment approved. Funding requests totaling \$18,336,891.68 were received, with only \$1.8 million available.

Extending Categorical Eligibility to Additional Children in a Household

LEAs recently received a memorandum addressing the United States Department of Agriculture's new policy relating to categorical eligibility for students receiving free meals. As noted in the memorandum, LEAs can now extend eligibility to all children in the household if one child's name is on the direct certification list or has a food stamp number on their application. Verification of Approved Applications for Free and Reduced Price Meal Benefits

Verification is confirmation of eligibility for free and reduced price meals under the National School Lunch Program or School Breakfast Program. Verification must include either confirmation of income eligibility or confirmation that the child is included in a certified Food Stamp household or Temporary Assistance unit. When a household responds that they no longer wish to receive benefits, rather than submitting the income documentation, they are considered a non-response. This document contains helpful information and sample letters to assist in accurately completing verification.

As a reminder, LEAs must verify at least as many applications calculated by the sample formula, but may do no more. While the verification sample cannot exceed the statutory limits, LEAs still have an obligation to verify questionable applications for cause. This may include, but is not limited to, situations where school officials have knowledge of household circumstances that would cause them to verify the information on the application.

Students who are categorically eligible because their sibling or other household member is listed on the direct certification list would be considered exempt from verification, as well as the student listed on the direct certification list.

Verification must be completed by Nov. 15, and LEAs must complete and submit the Free or Reduced Price Lunch Verification Summary Report to the State Agency by Dec. 15.
