## LODGING MANAGER

Plan, direct, or coordinate activities of an organization or department that provides lodging and other accommodations.

### Knowledge and Skills Needed

In addition to courses required for high school graduation, essential skills and knowledge needed for a career as a lodging manager are reinforced by taking rigorous and relevant courses, as well as participating in work-based experiences and student organization activities.
