MANAGER OF FOOD PREPARATION/SERVING WORKERS

Perform duties which combine both food preparation and food service, including first-line supervisor/manager of food preparation and serving workers.

Knowledge and Skills Needed

In addition to courses required for high school graduation, essential skills and knowledge needed for a career as a manager of food preparation or serving worker are reinforced by taking rigorous and relevant courses, as well as participating in work-based experiences and student organization activities.
