

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

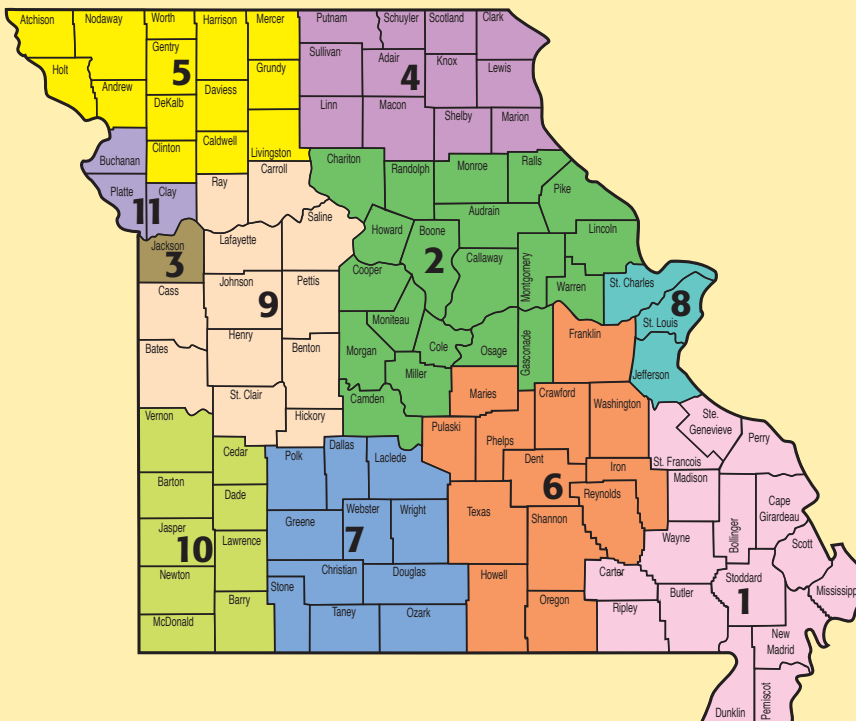
