EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP POLICY STANDARDS (ISLLC 2008)

An education leader promotes the success of every student by ...

1. Facilitating the development, articulation, implementation and stewardship of a vision of learning that is shared and supported by all stakeholders.

3. Ensuring management of the organization, operations and resources for a safe, efficient and effective learning environment.
4. Collaborating with faculty and community members, responding to diverse community interests and needs, and mobilizing community resources.
5. Acting with integrity, fairness and in an ethical manner.
6. Understanding, responding to and influencing the political, social, economic, legal and cultural context.

WHO: All practicing or aspiring leaders and administrators in public, private and parochial schools are eligible to attend.

WHY: The focus of this sustained program is to develop school leaders who can positively and significantly impact student performance through effective school improvement practices. School improvement mandates and standards are redefining the school administrator's role. Missouri school leaders and administrators must have continuous opportunities to develop and hone skills for instructional leadership.

WHERE: Regional Satellite Academy activities will be coordinated by facilitators through the regional professional development center in your area. The statewide meetings will be held in the Lake of the Ozarks area.

Once inside, in the programs box select DESE-Leadership Academy. Click Search Catalog. Scroll down and click on the title of the meeting or workshop you wish to attend. Follow the directions for new users. Remember or write down your userID and password, as you will need them in the future.
