- How, where and by whom the school district will provide services to eligible nonpublic school children, including a thorough consideration and analysis of the view of the nonpublic school officials on the provision of services through a contract with a third-party provider.
- How the school district will assess academically the services to eligible nonpublic school children in accordance with §200.10 and how the district will use the results of that assessment to improve Title I services.
- The size and scope of the equitable services that the school district will provide to eligible nonpublic school children and, consistent with §200.64, the proportion of funds that will be allocated to provide these services.
- The method or sources of data that the school district will use under §200.78 to determine the number of nonpublic school children from low income families residing in participating public school attendance areas, including whether the school district will extrapolate data, if a survey is used.
- The equitable services the district will provide to teachers and families of participating nonpublic school children.
- If the school district disagrees with the views of the nonpublic school officials on the provisions of services through a contract, the district must provide the nonpublic schools the reasons in writing why the district chooses not to use a contractor.
