<b>SUMMARY</b>				
This rule set forth the requirements to be eligible for scholarships permitted in Section 161.825, RSMo.				
This rule is being rescinded because Section 161.825, RSMo, had a sunset date of December 31, 2019, and it was not reauthorized by the general assembly. No entities have applied to be scholarship granting organizations under 5 CSR 10-2.010 (also being rescinded at this time), and there are no outstanding scholarships.				
Public comment was accepted from May 1, 2020, through May 31, 2020. During that time, there were no comments submitted.

<b>RECOMMENDATION</b>				
The Department recommends that the State Board of Education authorize publication in the <i>Missouri Register</i> of an order of rulemaking to rescind 5 CSR 10-2.030, Eligibility for Scholarships, and that the State Board finds the proposed rescission necessary to carry out the purposes of Sections 161.092 and 161.825.12, RSMo.

**ORDER OF RULEMAKING**

By the authority vested in the State Board of Education (board) under sections 161.092 and 161.825.12, RSMo Supp. 2013, the board rescinds the rule as follows:

**5 CSR 10-2.030** Eligibility for Scholarships is **rescinded**.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rescission was published in the Missouri register on May 1, 2020 (45 MoReg 589-590). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed rescission, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed rescission becomes effective thirty (30) days after the publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.
