SUMMARY

This rule outlined the criteria for innovative or alternative programs for preparing candidates for a certificate of license to teach in Missouri.

This rule is being rescinded because these requirements are included in 5 CSR 20-400.440 Procedures and Standards for Approval and Accreditation of Professional Education Programs in Missouri.

Public comment was accepted from May 1, 2020, through May 31, 2020. During that time, there were no comments received.

RECOMMENDATION

The Department recommends that the State Board of Education authorize publication in the *Missouri Register* of an order of rulemaking to rescind 5 CSR 20-400.320, Innovative and Alternative Professional Education Programs, and that the State Board finds the proposed rescission necessary to carry out the purposes of Sections 161.097, 168.011, 161.092, 168.021, and 168.081, RSMo.

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the State Board of Education (board) under sections 161.097 and 168.011, RSMo 2000 and 161.092, 161.021, and 168.081, RSMo Supp. 2005, the board rescinds the rule as follows:

5 CSR 20-400.320 Innovative and Alternative Professional Education Programs is **rescinded**.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rescission was published in the Missouri Register on May 1, 2020 (45 MoReg 590). No Changes have been made in the text of the proposed rescission, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed rescission becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.
