**SUMMARY**

This rule establishes the clinical experience requirements for candidates in professional education programs. The proposed amendment updates the definition of a teacher assistant.

Public comment was accepted from February 18, 2020 through March 19, 2020. During that time, there were no comments submitted.

**RECOMMENDATION**

The Department recommends that the State Board of Education authorize publication in the *Missouri Register* of an order of rulemaking to amend rule 5 CSR 20-400.330, Clinical Experience Requirements for Candidates in Professional Education Programs, and that the State Board finds the proposed amendment necessary to carry out the purposes of Sections 161.092, 161.097, 161.099, 168.021, and 168.400, RSMo.

**ORDER OF RULEMAKING**

By the authority vested in the State Board of Education (board) under sections 161.092, 161.097, 161.099, and 168.400, RSMo 2016 and section 168.021 RSMo Supp. 2019, the board amends the rule as follows:

**5 CSR 20-400.330** Clinical Experience Requirements for Candidates in Professional Education Programs is **amended**.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the Missouri register on February 18, 2020 (45 MoReg 311). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after the publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.
