STRATEGIC PRIORITY

Teachers and Leaders – Prepare, develop and support educators to ensure an effective teacher in every classroom and an effective leader in every school.

SUMMARY

On March 26, 2019 the State Board of Education approved a notice of proposed rulemaking to amend Rule 5 CSR 20-400.220. This rule has been amended to clarify the requirements for a substitute certificate and language was added which will require participation in professional development as a condition for renewal of the certificate.

No changes were made to the proposed rule.

RECOMMENDATION

The Department recommends that the State Board of Education authorize publication in the *Missouri Register* of an order of rulemaking to amend Rule 5 CSR 20-400.220, Application for Substitute Certificate of License to Teach, and that the State Board finds the amendment necessary to carry out the purposes of Sections 161.092, 168.011, 168.021, 168.071, and 168.081, RSMo.

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the State Board of Education under sections 161.092, 168.011, 168.071, and 168.081, RSMo 2016, and section 168.021, RSMo Supp. 2018, the rule amends as follows:

5 CSR 20-400.220 Application for Substitute Certificate of License to Teach **is amended**.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the Missouri Register on June 17, 2019 (44 MoReg 1665-1666). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the Code of State Regulations.
