SUMMARY:

Applicant's Name: Jesse R. Bilderback

On October 27, 2014, Jesse R. Bilderback applied for a substitute certificate of license to teach.

Offense: On February 5, 1999, Mr. Bilderback, age 17, was found to be in possession of a stolen car stereo.

Disposition: On June 24, 1999, Mr. Bilderback pled guilty and received a suspended execution of sentence to the felony, Receiving Stolen Property, in the Circuit Court of Buchanan County, case number 05CR03990529-01. Mr. Bilderback was sentenced to three years' supervised probation, which was completed early, and restitution of \$1,135.44.

Letters of Recommendation: Three (3) – (Intervention Specialist, Professor, Business Owner).

PETITION TO ENTER PLEA OF GUILTY

The defendant represents to the Court:

1. My full true name is Jesse Ray Bilderback. I am 17 years of age. I have gone to school up to and including the 10th grade.
2. I am represented by a lawyer. His name is Timi A. Lowdon.
3. I received a copy of the information (charge against me). I read the information and have discussed it with my lawyer. My lawyer explained every charge to me and I understand that I am charged with Receiving Stolen Property. I understand the nature of every charge against me.
4. I told my lawyer all the facts and circumstances known to me about the charges made against me in the information. I believe that my lawyer is fully informed on all such matters.
5. I know that the Court must be satisfied that there is a factual basis for a PLEA OF GUILTY before my plea can be accepted. I represent to the Court that I did the following acts in connection with the charges made against me: that on or about February 5, 1999 I was in possession of a car stolen & believed to be stolen as well as some tools and tool boxes. This all occurred in Buchanan County Missouri.
6. My lawyer has counseled and advised with me on the nature of each charge, on all lesser-included charges, if any, and on all possible defenses that I might have in this case.
7. I know that I may plead NOT GUILTY to any offense charged against me. If I plead NOT GUILTY, the Constitution guarantees me, among other possible rights, (a) the right to a speedy and public trial by jury (b) the right to see and hear all witnesses called to testify against me and to cross-examine all witnesses (c) the right to use the power and process of the Court to compel the production of any evidence, including the attendance of any witnesses in my favor (d) the right to have the assistance

of a lawyer at all stages of the proceedings, and (e) the right to take the witness stand at my sole option, and, if I do not take the witness stand, no inference of guilt may be drawn from such failure. If I plead GUILTY, I waive (give up) all these rights.

8. I know that if I plead GUILTY, there will be no trial either before a Court or jury, and the Court may impose the same punishment as if I had pleaded NOT GUILTY, stood trial and been convicted by a jury. I am also waiving my right to appeal the conviction and sentence.
9. I know that in the State of Missouri, the State must prove my guilt beyond a reasonable doubt and to the satisfaction of the jury and that all twelve (12) jurors must vote to convict me in order for me to be found GUILTY.
10. I know that I may be entitled to take this case out of this County and have it tried before a jury in some other County; also, I know that I may be entitled to disqualify the regular Judge of this Court and have another Judge hear my case or accept my plea.
11. My lawyer informed me that the range of punishment which the law provides is 1 to 7 years imprisonment, or 1 to 12 months in the County Jail, or a fine not exceeding \$ 5,000.00 or both the fine and confinement in jail.
12. If I am on probation or parole in this or any other Court, I know that by pleading GUILTY here, my probation or parole may be revoked, and I may be required to serve time in that case, which may be consecutive, that is, in addition to any sentence imposed upon me in this case.
13. I declare that no officer or agent of any branch of government (federal, state or local) has promised or suggested that I will receive a lighter sentence, or probation, or any other form of leniency if I plead GUILTY, except as follows: NONE

The Prosecuting Attorney promised that if I plead GUILTY, he/she will do the following:

Recommend a suspended imposition of sentence and probation, and will not file any additional charges.

If anyone else made any promises or suggestions, except as noted in the previous sentences, I know that he had no authority to do so. I know that the sentence I will receive is solely a matter within the control of the Judge. I hope to receive leniency, but I am prepared to accept any punishment permitted by law which the Court sees fit to impose. However, I respectfully request the Court to consider, in mitigation of punishment, that I have voluntarily entered a PLEA OF GUILTY. I understand if the court is not going to be bound by the plea agreement, the judge will inform me of this in open court and I will have an opportunity to withdraw my plea of guilty.

14. Neither I, nor any of my friends or loved ones, has been mistreated, threatened, coerced, or forced in any manner by anyone to get me to plead guilty, nor were there any promises, inducements, or representations made except as set forth in paragraph 13 above.
15. I believe that my lawyer has done all that anyone could do to counsel and assist me, and I AM SATISFIED WITH THE ADVICE AND HELP HE HAS GIVEN ME.
16. I know that the Court will not permit anyone to plead GUILTY, who maintains he is entirely innocent, and with that in mind and because I AM GUILTY, I wish to plead GUILTY and respectfully request the Court to accept my PLEA OF GUILTY.

17. My mind is clear, and I am not mentally ill. I am not under the influence of alcohol or drugs, and I am not under a doctor's care. The only drugs, medicines or pills that I took within the past seven (7) days are: NONE
(If none, so state.)
18. I do not have any complaints against any law enforcement officials concerning my treatment while in jail. I had sufficient food, water, medical care and bedding, and I was not mistreated by any inmate while in jail. There are no exceptions to any of these statements, except:

19. I OFFER MY PLEA OF GUILTY FREELY AND VOLUNTARILY AND OF MY OWN ACCORD AND WITH FULL UNDERSTANDING OF ALL THE MATTERS SET FORTH IN THE INFORMATION AND IN THIS PETITION.
20. I have read, and my attorney has explained to me, this Petition to Enter Plea of Guilty, this 21 day of June, 1999.





Explanation of Criminal Record

In January, 1999, I celebrated my 17th birthday. A week later some friends and I were arrested for entering their neighbor's garage. At first we had no intention of entering the garage or taking anything of value from it, only climbing onto it and sitting on the roof. One thing led to another and a couple individuals in our group entered the garage and removed some items of value from it. A chainsaw, radio, and a few miscellaneous tools were taken by our group. The next day we woke up to the St. Joseph Police Department knocking on my friend's door. They immediately suspected we were the guilty party and took us away in handcuffs. I was charged with a Class C Felony of Receiving Stolen Property. Even though I did not enter the garage or physically possess any of the stolen merchandise, I was still charged with the rest of the party involved. Throughout the legal process I was in full cooperation with law enforcement and prosecuting attorney. I completely understand that by being a part of the group and allowing the crimes to happen I am just as guilty as everyone involved. Downplaying what happened that night in any manner is not my intention; my intentions are only to relay the truth of the events as they happened. What I was a part of that night was wrong. My arrest and punishment was deserved. I received 60 days in the Buchanan County Jail and 3 years of probation for my crime. I was released from the county jail 15 days early for good behavior. I completed my probation on 08/15/2003. While incarcerated I had ample time to reflect upon my actions. It was not a pleasant experience and I realized that I never wanted to face the judicial system on negative terms again. Since then I have lived my life in a lawful manor. Unfortunately, having a felony conviction on my record can obstruct my advancement in many professional areas of my life. What I did was indeed an immoral and damaging act. However, I feel my actions since then have shown who I really am, a good, loving person with honorable intentions. I want nothing more than to move on from this incident and begin the career I have worked so hard for.


