Senate Bills 620 and 528

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- Sponsor - Senator Gary Romine
- Signed into law by Governor Nixon - June 3, 2016
- Effective date - August 28, 2016



Senate Bills 620 and 528

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- Known as the “**CTE Student Protection ACT**”
- Establishes the “**CTE Advisory Council**” within the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education
- Shown in Section **178.550.1, RS.Mo**

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- **CTE Advisory Council** composed of 15 members
 - Director of an area career center

 - An individual from the business community

 - Three current or retired CTE teachers who also serve or served as an advisor to any of the nationally-recognized CTSOs

Provisions of the Law

- The advisory council shall meet at least four times annually.
- The council shall elect from among its members
 - A chairperson
 - A vice-chairperson
 - A secretary-reporter
 - Other such officers as it deems necessary



Provisions of the Law

- The council will have a webpage on the DESE website.
- Records of any decisions, votes, exhibits or outcomes of advisory council meetings will be available on the council's webpage.
- Any materials prepared for council members shall be kept on the council's webpage.



Provisions of the Law

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- The council shall
 - develop a comprehensive statewide short- and long-range strategic plan for career and technical education.
 - identify service gaps and provide advice on methods to close such gaps as they relate to youth and adult employees, workforce development, and employers on training needs.
 - confer with public and private entities for the purpose of promoting and improving career and technical education.



Provisions of the Law

- The council shall
 - identify legislative recommendations to improve career and technical education.
 - promote coordination of existing career and technical education programs.
 - adopt, alter, or repeal by its own bylaws, rules and regulations governing the manner in which its business may be transacted.



Provisions of the Law

- The council shall
 - make an annual written report to the State Board of Education and the Commissioner of Education regarding the development, implementation, and administration of the state budget for career and technical education.
 - annually submit written recommendations to the State Board of Education and the Commissioner of Education regarding the oversight and procedures for the handling of funds for student career and technical education organizations.
