- 1. Briefly describe the program in the school before you taught, giving enrollment, classes taught, FFA activities, and adult programs.**
- 2. Explain changes you have made in program offerings, FFA activities, adult involvement, and community activities during your first year.**
- 3. Describe the level of your personal involvement in community activities.**
- 4. How have you been involved with other school organizations, clubs, teachers, and non-agriculture students?**
- 5. What was one of your major problems during your first year of teaching and how did you resolve the situation?**
- 6. List four goals you will plan to achieve for your department during your next year of teaching.**
- 7. Give an example of how you met the teaching/learning needs of a problem or special needs student.**
- 8. What do you feel was your greatest achievement during your first year of teaching?**
- 9. List 10 major awards received during your first year of teaching. This could include personal, FFA chapter, or student. (Examples: State FFA degrees, proficiencies, student scholarships, teacher awards, chapter awards, community awards, etc.)**
- 10. How many on-site SAE visits did you make during your first year of teaching and what was your most memorable visit?**
