Commodity Expos January 26-28, 2011

DESE – SFS will again be holding Commodity Expos throughout Missouri to give Local Education Agencies (LEAs) the opportunity to learn more about the USDA Donated Foods (DF) Program and the processed items available for the 2011 – 2012 school year. **ALL LEAs** are strongly encouraged to attend the Commodity Expos, specifically the person(s) responsible for completing the processing packet. Participants will also have the opportunity to sample approved items from processors.

1. Central MO – Waynesville Career Center
 - Wednesday, January 26, 2011
2. St. Louis area – Francis Howell Central H.S.
 - Thursday, January 27, 2011
3. Kansas City area – Fort Osage Campus
 - Friday, January 28, 2011

Make plans to join the DESE – SFS staff at one of the locations to experience a great show of processed food and a day to network with other Food Service Directors from across the state.


An educational session will begin the Expo each day, followed by the food show of approved processed items for SY 11-12, and areas set-up for DESE – SFS staff to work through the processing packet with any LEA wishing to seek our assistance. The educational session will include a brief overview of the DF Program here in Missouri and will also include discussions about enhancements to the DF Program on the horizon.

Mrs. Clark's BBQ Sauce

Mrs. Clark's did not have BBQ Sauce (52928 – 4/1 gal or 52978 – 216 portion cups) available in time to make December week 1 deliveries. Any LEA ordering either item and receiving deliveries during December week 1 will not receive the item in December. The quantities not received in December will be backordered by Food Distribution Associates to be received in January. LEA's receiving deliveries weeks 2 – 4 will receive their product as requested.

Chicken Fajita Strips

The A563 Chicken Fajita Strips apparently had a bumpy ride before arriving at FDA and some of the cases were pretty banged up. FDA contacted DESE – SFS and we are aware of the issue. FDA was instructed to receive the deliveries because make-up orders would not be filled by USDA and the product was not damaged (only the cases), plus DESE – SFS did not want to delay LEAs any longer from receiving the product. Please accept our apology for the banged up cases, but enjoy the tasty fajita strips inside☺!

Open Order UPDATES

DESE – SFS recently received a few “extra” items from the Family Support Division, which is the Missouri agency administering the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) which some LEAs participate in during the summer. DESE – SFS received the below and will make the items available via the Open Order.

- A061 – Green Beans, 305 cases
- A350 – Applesauce, 2 cases
- A364 – Cherries, IQF, 40 lbs, 240 cases
- A382 – Apricots Diced, 60 cases
- B119 – Am Cheese Slcd, Red Fat, 128 cases

A061 and A350 will be offered via Open Order with the next planned distributions, February and March respectively. (see [Open Order Items anticipated for SY 10-11](#)). A364, A382 and B119 are offered on the December Open Order for January delivery. Please remember the B119 American Cheese, Sliced, REDUCED FAT is offered **in addition** to the B065 American Cheese which will be Prorated out to each LEA in January.

- ★ A160 – Frozen Peas were not received by the USDA supplier during the requested time period and were not available for Dec distribution. The A160

trucks have now been received by Food Distribution Associates and will ship to LEAs in Jan. The orders submitted in Nov for Dec will be adjusted down and actually ship in Jan.
