Monitoring	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School District must perform on-site review for each site in the 1st and 4th weeks of SFSP operations • DHSS will review School District during the first year of SFSP operations and at least once every three years thereafter 			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Schools must perform on-site review and complete the on-site school review form for Seamless Summer Option sites for each site within first three weeks of Seamless Summer operations • If an administrative review is conducted during the 18-19 school year, DESE will review Seamless Summer program in 2019

<p>Eligible Participants</p>	<p>Children in low-income areas 18 years of age or younger, as well as disabled adults over age 18 enrolled in school during the regular school year</p>	<p>Same as SFSP</p>
<p>Public Notification</p>	<p>DHSS sends required public media notice for School District. School District is encouraged to conduct local outreach.</p>	<p>School is responsible for public notification</p>
<p>Training</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School District is required to train Program staff annually. • Attendance at DHSS training required for new and returning sponsors. Encouraged thereafter but not required. 	<p>School encouraged to conduct NSLP, School Breakfast Program and CACFP training of local staff, but not required.</p>
<p>Site Change Reporting</p>	<p>Site changes are reported on-line, and include meal service time change, changes in operating dates, field trips, etc.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An additional approval is required for all site additions • School must report meal service time changes and site closures
<p>Meal Pattern</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Meal pattern must meet standards found in SFSP regulations at 7 CFR 225.16(d) <p style="text-align: center;">OR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School Districts may use NSLP/SBP menu planning system used during the regular school year • School Districts may use offer vs. serve if they do so during the regular school year 	<p>NSLP/SBP/CACFP meal patterns/ menu planning system used during the regular school-year</p> 
<p>Claims for Reimbursement</p>	<p>School Districts will be reimbursed based on the number of meals served multiplied by the meal rates shown above, which include both an administrative and operational component. The “lesser of” cost comparison for SFSP reimbursement has been eliminated!</p>	<p>School will be reimbursed based on the number of meals served multiplied by the single meal rates shown in the Reimbursement Rates section above</p>
