DEPARTMENT GOAL NO. 1:

All Missouri students will graduate college and career ready.

SUMMARY:

On February 16, 2016, the State Board of Education approved a notice of proposed rulemaking to amend 5 CSR 20-100.110, Programs for Gifted Children. The notice of proposed rulemaking was published for comment in the April 1, 2016, edition of the *Missouri Register*. No comments were received during the 30-day comment period.

The language of the administrative rule for gifted programs has been updated to reflect current terminology and does not change existing practice. The rule establishes selection criteria and delivery of gifted services for state-assisted gifted programs.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Department recommends that the State Board of Education authorize publication in the *Missouri Register* of an order of rulemaking to amend Rule 5 CSR 20-100.110 relating to Programs for Gifted Children, and that the State Board finds this amendment necessary to carry out the purposes of Sections 162.720, 161.092 and 162.675, RSMo.

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the State Board of Education under sections 162.720, RSMo 2000, section 161.092, RSMo Supp. 2014, and section 162.675, RSMo Supp. 2013, the board amends as follows:

5 CSR 20-100.110 Programs for Gifted Children is **amended**.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on April 1, 2016 (41 MoReg 443). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.
