

June Cycle MOSIS and Core Data Reporting During COVID-19

June Cycle Due Date

The June cycle remains due June 30, 2020. Exceptions to this include information for students related to Industry Recognized Credentials (IRCs) and Technical Skill Assessments (TSAs), the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB), and the Summer School Application. Please review those sections below for the revised due dates.

June Student Core/Student Enrollment and Attendance Reporting

Reporting Enrollment of New Students

Students that enroll during COVID-19 should be reported in the June Cycle. Administrative Memo [FAS-20-002](#) states “Hours forgiven are considered not in session and no attendance or hours of absence will be reported even though educational opportunities continue to be provided for students remotely.” Although the hours forgiven are not reported during the COVID-19 time period, we recommend reporting one hour of attendance in the MOSIS June Student Enrollment and Attendance file for new enrollments. This will not impact ADA and will avoid triggering a MOSIS edit that will require attendance hours.

Entry and Exit Dates

The MOSIS June Student Enrollment and Attendance information for entry and exit dates should reflect the originally planned dates through the end of the regular school year. Please note this varies from what will be reported on Core Data Screen 10-Calendar, where the actual end date should be the date of last attendance prior to buildings closing due to COVID-19.

Attendance and Absence Hours

Administrative Memo [FAS-20-002](#) includes information about calendar and attendance reporting. Additional information from the March 13, 2020 webinar is included in the [FAQ](#).

- Hours forgiven during COVID-19 are considered not in session and no attendance or absence hours will be reported.
- Any student absence due to COVID-19 prior to school closure would be coded like any other student absence related to illness.
- The 94% or 47% attendance for MOCAP and virtual courses should be based on the new lower hours in session it would have taken to complete the course in-seat.

Industry Recognized Credentials (IRCs) and Technical Skill Assessments (TSAs)

The [Department Cancels Required Statewide Assessments Due to COVID-19: Impact on Local Education Agencies and 2020 Graduating Seniors document](#) states “For 2020 graduates, schools may administer IRCs or TSAs through August 31, 2020 (the due date for Perkins V Core Indicators of Performance).”

- The June cycle has a due date of June 30, 2020; however, student records for IRCs and TSAs in the MOSIS June Student Core file may continue to be updated through August 31, 2020.

Dyslexia Reporting

Administrative Memo [COM-20-003](#) states “The End of Year Dyslexia screening requirement is waived through the end of the 2019-20 school year.”

- Students that were screened before COVID-19 should be reported with the appropriate coding in the June MOSIS Student Core file. Students not screened due to COVID-19 should be reported as ‘NS’ for not screened in MOSIS. Core Data Screen 38, which collects the method used to test dyslexia, should be reported.

Physical Education Reporting

Administrative Memo [COM-20-002](#) states “The original reporting for Missouri fitness assessments, due in June, is waived.”

- Students not tested due to COVID-19 should be reported as ‘Not Tested’ in the June MOSIS Student Core file.

Missouri Option Graduate Reporting

In relation to HiSET testing, the [Department Cancels Required Statewide Assessments Due to COVID-19: Impact on Local Education Agencies and 2020 Graduating Seniors document](#) states “DESE has extended the deadline to test until August 31. Students who should have tested by June 30 but successfully complete the test by August 31 will be credited to the prior year for graduation and dropout calculations. While no APR will be calculated based on the current year data, the graduation rate calculations will provide a basis for trend data in future APRs.”

- The deadline for reporting students who graduate under the Missouri Option Program by passing the HiSET has been extended to August 31, 2020; districts have until that date to apply 2020 Missouri Option graduates to their prior year graduates in the June Student Enrollment and Attendance file.

Early Childhood Outcome Reporting

The Office of Special Education sent out a SELS message on April 15, 2020, regarding the reporting of Early Childhood Outcomes data for children entering or exiting Early Childhood Special Education. Please reference <https://lists.mo.gov/archives/sels/2020-April/000230.html>.

Student Course Completion Reporting

The Student Course Completion file is necessary to be reported due to its use for various programs. These include, but are not limited to, the Missouri Course Access and Virtual School Program (MOCAP), Annual Performance Reports (APR) and Career Technical Education (CTE) Base Funding.

End-of-Course (EOC) Exception Reporting

The [Department Cancels Required Statewide Assessments Due to COVID-19: Impact on Local Education Agencies and 2020 Graduating Seniors document](#) states “If a student was enrolled in a class with a required EOC for the 2019-20 school year, that student will be assigned a special exemption code that will follow them throughout their high school career. The code will stand in place of an EOC score for that class. Those students will not be required to take the EOC for the classes they were enrolled in during 2019-20.”

- EOC Exception Codes will not need to be reported for students that meet this criteria. The department will assign an exemption code internally for students.
- If you have a student that has earned a diploma based on individualized education program (IEP) goals for the 2019-20 school year and previously participated in the Missouri Assessment Program (MAP) Alternate Assessment, the exception for American Government is still required. This exception is included in the criteria for determining college and career readiness measures for performance standards 3.1-3 and 3.4 of the state annual performance report (APR).

ASVAB

The deadline for the ASVAB collection has been extended to August 31, 2020.

June ID/College and Career Readiness (CCR) ID Cleanup

Due to the cancelling of statewide assessments for this school year, there will be no June ID cleanup file generated for school districts to clean up assessment data.

The Department is working with the CCR entities for new dates of delivery and the CCR ID Cleanup files will be generated later than usual. We will update you when we have additional information.

Career Technical Student Organization (CTSO) Collection

The CTSO Collection will not be reported for this school year.

Core Data Screen 10-School Calendar Reporting

Administrative Memo [FAS-20-002](#) includes information about calendar and attendance reporting.

Additional information from the March 13, 2020 webinar is included in the [FAQ](#).

- Hours forgiven are considered not in session and no attendance or hours of absence will be reported.
- On Core Data Screen 10-Calendar, days that buildings are closed due to COVID-19 should not be reported in the count of days.
- On Core Data Screen 10-Calendar, the actual end date should be the date of last attendance prior to school buildings closing due to COVID-19.

Core Data Screen 24A-Summer School Application Reporting

The deadline for Core Data Screen 24A has been extended to June 1, 2020.
