<p><b>DEPARTMENT GOAL NO. 1:</b></p> <p>All Missouri students will graduate college and career ready.</p> <p><b>SUMMARY:</b></p> <p>In April 2016, the State Board of Education approved the Missouri Learning Standards: Grade- and Course-Level Expectations in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies—for all students in Missouri’s public schools. As a result, local education agencies must develop curricula based upon those new learning expectations.</p> <p>Curriculum staff launched the Professional Learning Series in 2016, which focused on providing professional development and other resources for Missouri educators to support their efforts to develop district-level curricula aligned to the new learning expectations.
