CONCENTRATIONS OF LOW-INCOME CHILDREN FOR PURPOSES OF NATIONAL DEFENSE  
EDUCATION, NATIONAL DIRECT AND FEDERAL PERKINS STUDENT LOAN  
CANCELLATION**

Item**DEPARTMENT GOAL NO. 1:**

All Missouri students will graduate college and career ready.

**SUMMARY:**

The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) utilized Rule 5 CSR 20-200.220, Relating to Determining Schools Having High Concentrations of Low-Income Children for Purposes of National Defense Education, National Direct and Federal Perkins Student Loan Cancellation. Teachers who have been the recipients of National Defense Education loans, National Direct Student loans or Federal Perkins Student loans may be eligible for partial cancellation of their loans if they are teaching in schools with high concentrations of low-income children. DESE, in cooperation with the United States Department of Education (USDE), annually prepares a list of schools having high concentrations of low-income students under criteria provided by the USDE. This rule set forth the procedures to be followed by DESE in compiling the list of these schools. This rule can be rescinded as DESE no longer determines which schools can be submitted. This determination is made by the USDE.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

The Department recommends that the State Board of Education authorize publication in the *Missouri Register* of a notice of proposed rulemaking to rescind Rule 5 CSR 20-200.220, Relating to Determining Schools Having High Concentrations of Low-Income Children for Purposes of National Defense Education, National Direct and Federal Perkins Student Loan Cancellation, and that the State Board finds this proposed rescission necessary.

**PROPOSED RESCISSION**

**5 CSR 20-200.220 Determining Schools Having High Concentrations of Low-Income Children for Purposes of National Defense Education, National Direct and Federal Perkins Student Loan Cancellation.** This rule established teachers who have been the recipients of National Defense Education loans, National Direct Student loans or Federal Perkins Student loans may be eligible for partial cancellation of their loans if they are teaching in schools with high concentrations of low-income children. The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE), in cooperation with the United States Department of Education (USDE), annually prepares a list of schools having high concentrations of low-income students under criteria provided by the USDE.

*PURPOSE: This rule can be rescinded. DESE no longer determines which schools can be submitted. This determination is made by the USDE as they have the established criteria for which schools can be submitted.*

*AUTHORITY: sections 178.430 and 178.440, RSMo 1986. This rule previously filed as 5 CSR 50-300.010. Original rule filed Dec. 24, 1975, effective Jan. 3, 1976. Rescinded and readopted: Filed Jan. 27, 1993, effective Aug. 9, 1993. Moved to 5 CSR 20-200.220, effective Aug. 16, 2011.*

*PUBLIC COST: This proposed rescission will not cost state agencies or political subdivisions more than five hundred dollars (\$500) in the aggregate.*

*PRIVATE COST: This proposed rescission will not cost private entities more than five hundred dollars (\$500) in the aggregate.*
