Dr. Barton A. (Bart) Washer, Professor in Career and Technology Education (CTE), has served at the University of Central Missouri since 2002. He currently serves as Chair for the Department of Middle, Secondary, and Adult Education (MSAE, effective July 1, 2017). This teacher education-focused department includes degree programs in middle level education, secondary education, technology and occupational education, literacy education, alternative teacher certification, career and technical education, and adult education. In addition, the Department of MSAE offers several certification, foundation, and field experience courses to all teacher education candidates at UCM, while offering career and technical education teacher certification and professional development courses nationwide.

Prior to serving as Chair of MSAE, Dr. Washer served as Professor and Chair of the Department of Career and Technology Education. This comprehensive department included undergraduate degree programs in occupational education (for skilled technical sciences and health sciences teachers), professional secondary education (agriculture teacher education, business teacher education, engineering and technology teacher education, and family consumer sciences teacher education programs), and graduate degree programs (MS and EdS degrees).

While at UCM from 2002 to 2016, Dr. Washer served as Graduate Program Coordinator for the CTE Department's Master of Science in CTE Leadership degree and the Education Specialist in Human Services (Technology and Occupational Education) degree. Prior to 2002, he served at the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education as Supervisor of Trade and Industrial Education, and later as the Director of Trade, Industrial, and Health Sciences Education.

Dr. Washer's teaching responsibilities and interests include scientific research design and methodology, curriculum development theory, and student performance assessment encompassing the cognitive, psychomotor, and affective learning domains, and student thesis development.
