SUMMARY:

Bryan McArthur holds a career continuous professional certificate of license to teach in the area of Social Studies, grades 7–12; a transition administrator certificate in the area of Principal, grades 7–12; and an initial administrator certificate in the area of Superintendent, grades K–12. Mr. McArthur is not currently teaching in Missouri.

On July 11, 2014, Mr. McArthur was found guilty of the Felony, Forgery. On January 14, 2015, Mr. McArthur received a suspended imposition of sentence (SIS) and was sentenced to three years supervised probation.

While serving in his capacity as a high school principal he instructed a student to forge his son's name on a check, which he then deposited in his personal bank account.

Mr. McArthur received notice of the hearing, but was neither present nor represented through counsel.
