Membership

FCCLA has a national membership of more than 150,000 young men and women in over 5,300 chapters in 52 state associations, including the Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico. Since its founding in 1945, FCCLA has involved more than ten million youth. Former members may join Alumni & Associates.

Currently, Missouri FCCLA has 9,839 members in 329 local chapters, ranking as the fourth largest FCCLA state association in the nation.

Governance

Ten national officers are elected by the voting delegates at the annual National Leadership Conference and comprise the National Executive Council.

Missouri FCCLA has 14 regional associations. Each region elects an officer to serve on the State Executive Council. From these officers up to two are elected as national officer candidates.

FCCLA is the ultimate leadership experience, focusing on character development, creative and critical thinking, interpersonal communications, practical knowledge, and career preparation.


Financial Support

FCCLA is supported primarily by student membership dues. Additional funds are raised from individuals, corporations and foundations. FCCLA is endorsed by the U.S. Department of Education (Office of Career, Technical, and Adult Education) and the American Association of Family and Consumer Sciences.

Staff

An executive director leads the organization and heads a national staff that carries out programs, communications, membership services and financial management.

The state advisor of Missouri FCCLA is employed by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. The state advisor is a supervisor in the family consumer sciences and human services section within the Office of College and Career Readiness.
