<p>DEPARTMENT GOAL NOS 1 AND 3:</p> <p>All Missouri students will graduate college and career ready.</p> <p>Missouri will prepare, develop and support effective educators.</p> <p>SUMMARY:</p> <p>The National Math + Science Initiative (NMSI) was formed to increase the number of students who are prepared to take rigorous college courses in the critical subjects of science, technology, engineering and math (STEM). Its goal is to ensure that all students, no matter what their financial circumstances, race, or gender, have access to careers in these promising fields.
