SUMMARY:

On September 17, 2013, the State Board of Education approved a notice of proposed rulemaking to adopt 5 CSR 20-200.290, relating to Physical Fitness Challenge/Assessment “Cade’s Law”. This notice of proposed rulemaking was published in the *Missouri Register* on November 1, 2013, (38 MoReg 1762). No written comments were received during the thirty (30)-day time period which ended on December 1, 2013.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Department recommends the State Board of Education authorize publication in the *Missouri Register* of an order of rulemaking to adopt rule 5 CSR 20-200.290, relating to a Physical Fitness Challenge/Assessment “Cade’s Law”, in the *Missouri Register* and that the State Board finds this adoption necessary to carry out the purpose of Sections 161.092, RSMo Supp. 2012 and 161.450, RSMo 2013.

**ORDER OF RULEMAKING**

By the authority vested in the State Board of Education (board) under sections 161.092 and 178.530, RSMo Supp. 2012, the board adopts a rule as follows:

**5 CSR 20-200.290 Physical Fitness Challenge/Assessment “Cade’s Law” is adopted**

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rule was published in the *Missouri Register* on November 1, 2013(38 MoReg 1691-1854). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed rule, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed rule becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.
