SUMMARY			
On December 6, 2018, the State Board of Education approved a notice of proposed rulemaking to rescind Rule 5 CSR 20-400.250. This rule is being rescinded due to all content area certification requirements being contained within 5 CSR 20-400.510 – 20-400.680 thus making 5 CSR 20-40.250 redundant.

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the State Board of Education under sections 161.092, 168.021, 168.071, 168.081, and 168.400, RSMo Supp. 2011, and section 168.011, RSMo 2000, the board rescinds a rule as follows:

5 CSR 20-400.250 Certificate of License to Teach Content Areas is rescinded

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the Missouri Register on March 1, 2019 (44 MoReg 774). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed rescission, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed rescission becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.
