DEPARTMENT GOAL NO. 1:

All Missouri students will graduate college and career ready.

SUMMARY:

On May 17, 2016, the State Board of Education approved a notice of proposed rulemaking to rescind Rule 5 CSR 20-200.120, Relating to Allowable Activities and Participating Student Eligibility until the tax credit was repealed in 2008 with House Bill 2058. This rule defined activities which were considered as permissible through the Sponsorship and Mentoring Program and categories of students eligible for program participation. This notice of proposed rulemaking was published in the *Missouri Register* on July 1, 2016 (41 MoReg 833). No written comments were received during the thirty (30) day time period which ended on July 31, 2016.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Department recommends that the State Board of Education authorize publication in the *Missouri Register* of an order of rulemaking to rescind Rule 5 CSR 20-200.120, Relating to Allowable Activities and Participating Student Eligibility, and that the State Board finds this rescission necessary to carry out the purpose of Section 135.348, RSMo.

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the State Board of Education (board) under section 135.348, RSMo Supp. 1998, the board rescinds a rule as follows:

5 CSR 20-200.120 Allowable Activities and Participating Student Eligibility is rescinded.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rescission was published in the *Missouri Register* on July 1, 2016 (41 MoReg 833). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed rescission, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed rescission becomes effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The State Board of Education (board) received no comments on the proposed rescission.
