



Percent of students scoring proficient or advanced




College and Career Readiness




Four-year Graduation Rate




Average Daily Attendance

Percentage of Missouri students attending class 90% of the time




Top 10 by 20 – Graduation Rate

Four-year Graduation Rate




Top 10 by 20 - NAEP

Percent of students scoring proficient or advanced





Percent of students scoring proficient or advanced





- Upgraded allocation and payment system for more efficient funding distribution

- Automated process for matching CCR records for APR calculation saving nearly 200 hours of personnel time

The Consolidated State Plan and ESSA

- The consolidated state plan will reflect what Missouri values in education and how quality education is defined.
- Feedback from regional meetings will inform the consolidated state plan.
- Elements of the consolidated state plan will be used to meet the requirements under ESSA.
- ESSA will not drive the consolidated state plan.

- First public comment period – deadline August 1
- Department submitted comments
 - Consolidated plan requirements
 - Timeline for implementation of accountability systems
 - Identification of schools for comprehensive or targeted improvement



Public Comment on ESSA Regulations

19

- Department submitted comments (continued)
 - Resource inequities (teacher experience and per pupil expenditures)
 - Data reporting/report card
 - Grant award process
 - Allocation of school improvement funds
 - Public notice
 - Single, summative ratings for schools

- Deadline – September 9
 - Title IA – Academic Assessments
 - Title IIB – Innovative pilot/demonstration authority
