- QUALIFIED TAX BREAKS – VR can consult with you on possible tax breaks for hiring VR applicants.






The Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) program is funded, in part, with a federal grant awarded by the Department of Education. In FFY 2019, the program received \$61,980,296 of federal funds and \$16,715,882 of state funds for VR services. Total funding of \$78,696,178 was comprised of 78.7% federal monies and 21.3% of state matching funds.
