A quick note about Test Materials Ordering – Please be sure to watch the training webinar and read the section in the manual before completing the ordering process. Additionally, when ordering paper materials (for students who have an IEP or students for whom using technology would be a barrier, please note that Tier A is for newcomer students, Tier C for those students who are on the verge of exiting and Tier B for the other 80-90% of students.

Finally, DRC sent out three memos on Friday to District Test Coordinators, with the third being sent also to District IT Coordinators. If you did not receive these emails and you are the District Test Coordinator, it means you are not listed as the DTC in the WIDA-AMS.us system. Please contact me to get that rectified. Additionally, if you are a District Test Coordinator and do not have an account on WIDA.us, you can contact me as well to get that setup. For all non- DTCs, your DTC can set you up with accounts on either the WIDA.us training site, or the WIDA-AMS.us administration portal. Please contact them directly if you do not have an account and feel you should.
