Standards	Show-Me Standards	SAME	The words Standards and Show-Me Standards reference fine arts standards for the state of Missouri.
Show-Me Standards or Standards	Missouri Learning Standards	Not the Same	Show Me Standards were part of HB1490 (2014). Fine Arts has 5 standards. Missouri Learning Standards for Fine Arts (Adopted in 2019) are the grade level expectations for each Big Idea of each Standard.
Artist Processes (National)	Strands (Missouri)	SAME	Everything an artist does will fit into one of these for categories.
Anchor Standards (National)	Big Idea (Missouri)	SAME	Anchor Standards are the standards that were released with the New Fine Arts National Standards. Missouri cannot use this title because they already have standards by the law of HB1490 The title Big Idea provides ‘what is to be learned’ within each of the strands. Note* <i>Your district could use the title ‘Big Idea’ differently when talking about units and lesson plans.</i>
Anchor Standards (National)	Standards	Not the Same	In the State of Missouri the title Standards refers to the five fine arts Show-Me Standards (HB1490)
Process Components (National)	Process Standards (Missouri)	Not the Same	Process components (National) are the actions artists carry out as they complete each artistic process. Process Standards (Missouri) refers to the back side of the Show-Me Standards (<i>Blue Placemat</i>). <i>They state what a student is to be able to do.</i>
Process Components (National)	Concepts (Missouri)	SAME	Process Components (National) are the actions artists carry out as they complete each artistic process. Concepts (Missouri) are from the 2005-2007 Missouri GLEs.
Missouri Learning Standards for Fine Arts	Grade Level Expectations (GLEs)	SAME	Missouri Learning Standards for Fine Arts (Adopted in 2019) are the grade level expectations for each Big Idea of each Standard.
