A successful screening program relies on the parent educator's ability to promote the healthy growth and development of all children. Good health begins with knowing and understanding current information and best practice guidelines. This session for the experienced Parent Educator will visit the role of the parent educator in the screening process, look at the components of the PAT Health screening, discuss the most effective ways to use the Health Record, identify the "Red Flags" in the area of health, explore how and when to make a referral, and brainstorm resources, information, and follow-up activities for parents.
