HB1052	Barnes	Requires the department of social services to develop incentive programs to encourage health care facilities to co-locate on the property of certain public elementary and secondary schools.	Prefiled
HB1061	Otto	Changes the laws regarding the attendance of a pupil from an unaccredited school district. Requires school attendance the year prior to transfer.	Prefiled
HB1062	Grisamore	Changes the laws regarding services for individuals with disabilities. Creates work group relating to work experiences.	Prefiled

HB1157	Lair	Requires the state board of education to adopt a rule on student data accessibility, transparency, and accountability in the statewide longitudinal data system.	Prefiled
