This presentation will focus on assisting Health Science educators to be on the cutting edge of creating formative and summative assessments that align to competencies. Technology Centers That Work (TCTW) will support creation of assessments that meet the rigor of state and national assessments and align with competencies. Topics will include:

- Overview of formative and summative assessments using Classroom Assessment for Student Learning (CASL) and Webb's Depth of Knowledge (DOK).
- Learn that SUMMATIVE Assessment is the “*Assessment OF Learning*” with the essential question: How much have students learned as of a particular point in time?
- Internalize and apply that FORMATIVE Assessment is “*Assessment FOR Learning*” with the essential question: How can we use assessment information to help students learn more?

After working on creating assessments, a next step is equipping Health Science educators with instructional strategies to teach to the assessments planned in the morning session. Educators will use their assessments, along with:

- Determine which strategies will be incorporated in the classroom.
- Take away research-based strategies to immediately apply lessons.
