Identified As An Eligible Migrant Who Is Counted for State Funding Purposes (This number includes only those identified migrant students who have an eligible COE reported to the MELL Office):

- The child is ages 3 through 21 and has not graduated from high school or does not hold a high school equivalency certificate (this means that the child is entitled to a free public education or is of an age below compulsory school attendance); **and**
- The child is a migrant agricultural worker or a migrant fisher or has a parent, spouse, or guardian who is a migrant agricultural worker or a migrant fisher; **and**
- The child has moved within the preceding 36 months in order to obtain (or seek) or to accompany (or join) a parent, spouse, or guardian to obtain (or seek), temporary or seasonal employment in qualifying agricultural or fishing work; **and**
- The child has moved from one school district to another; **and**
- The district has on file a Certificate of Eligibility signed by the state Director of Migrant Education for each child being served.

Migrant Student Served During Regular School Term Definition (This number includes only those identified migrant students who have an eligible COE reported to the MELL Office) and who were reported in the April MOSIS Cycle as PN, NP, CA, or CR): An eligible migrant student that received any services during the regular school year in 2009-2010.

Migrant Student Received Summer School Instruction Definition (This number includes only those identified migrant students who have an eligible COE reported to the MELL Office) and who were reported in the August MOSIS Summer School File): An eligible migrant student that received instruction during summer school in 2009.

Priority for Services Migrant Student Definition (This number includes only those identified migrant students who have an eligible COE reported to the MELL Office) and who were reported in the April MOSIS Cycle as PS or PN):

A migratory child identified as a priority for services Migrant Student based on the following criteria:

- scored at Below Basic on the MAP; or is an English Language Learner (Students coded: LEP); or has an age/grade discrepancy; or was retained; or
- is at risk of failing to meet state graduation requirements in one of the following areas: an unweighted GPA of 2.0 or below or insufficient credits for promotion or graduation
and
- whose education has been interrupted during the regular school year.

LEA Per Pupil Expenditure (PPE) < State's average PPE Definition (Number provided by DESE):

If the local school district where migrant students reside has a per pupil expenditure (PPE) below the State's average PPE, multiply the eligible migrant count by .5. If the district's PPE is greater than or equal to the State's average PPE, then the district has moderate resources and the eligible migrant count will be multiplied by 0.
