


Room Layouts for TEL

This following pages contain a series of diagrams that show how the room you identify might be rearranged for the assessment.


Your NAEP representative will determine the best arrangement based on the characteristics of the room you identify. If setting up for the assessment requires rearranging any furniture, the NAEP team will put back the furniture when they are finished.

For the room setup diagrams, the following conventions are used:

Symbol	Meaning
	Laptop, numbered. Student laptops are labeled 1–15; the administrator laptop is labeled 16.
	Power strip, plugged into wall outlet
	Cables taped to floor with gaffer tape (this tape will not leave residue on carpet)
	Classroom chair
	Wireless router
	Cable plugged into floor outlet


U Shape with Laptops Facing Inward

- Most convenient setup for NAEP staff
- Cables are not positioned where students might walk and trip
- Students face away from each other
- Admin laptop and router are in a central location




Classroom Style

- Good for science labs or other situations where it is impractical to relocate desks or tables




Pods

- Best when there are many floor electrical outlets
- Also useful in locations where only round tables are available



Long Tables

- Good choice for very long rooms

- Good for rooms with floor outlets
