

What Is FERPA?

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) is a federal law designed to protect the privacy of a student's education records.

Who Is Subject to FERPA?

All public schools and local education agencies are subject to FERPA. The Missouri Migrant Education Program (which provides instruction for students) is also subject to FERPA.

What Does It Mean for Me?

FERPA gives certain rights to parents regarding their children's education records. Parents and eligible students (students/former students 18 years or older) have three basic rights under FERPA:

1. The right to have access to education records.
2. The right to have the records amended.
3. The right to have some control over the disclosure of information from the records.



How Do I Know My Rights Are Being Protected?

FERPA generally requires that education agencies and institutions obtain prior written consent from a parent before disclosing information from the education records of his or her child.


FERPA also requires education agencies and institutions to adopt a policy regarding how they meet the requirements of FERPA (Section 99.6 of the regulations) and to notify parents and eligible students of their rights under the law (Section 99.7 of the regulations).

Can Education Agencies and Institutions Ever Disclose Records Without My Prior Written Consent?

Yes. Under FERPA, there are certain circumstances in which education agencies and institutions may disclose information from education records without prior written consent.

For example, a school may release education records to officials of other school systems in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

Also, disclosure of education records without consent to local/state education authorities in order to carry out requirements of the Missouri Migrant Education Program is generally permissible under FERPA. However, this information will not be provided to federal immigration services or to other immigration-related groups without the knowledge and express approval of parents.



Please Note

As a parent, guardian or person otherwise responsible for a child enrolled in the Missouri Migrant Education Program, you must be informed of the provisions of FERPA and of the possibility that the child's education records may be sent to other schools in which the child might enroll. This brochure is intended to serve that purpose.
