The Five Phases of the Dropout Prevention Project are:


1. **To develop State and Local Leadership Teams**

consists of five phases. It is a systemic process that involves the use of proven practice that work to keep students in school. It is based on research in the area of dropout prevention and utilizes the implementation of evidence-based practices as they apply to the individual needs of a school.




The project uses

data based-decision making to identify students at risk, identify priority areas for intervention, identify and select evidence-based practice to address needs and to develop and implement effective programs in dropout prevention.

The project consists of

a framework which involves 6 days of intensive training with modules based on the most current research in dropout prevention. At the end of the training schools will develop an evidence-based intervention plan. This plan will include interventions and evaluation of effectiveness.



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
