

## College and Career Competency Wheel



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## Post-Secondary Success Project



Provides training to interdisciplinary high school teams across the state of Missouri in an effort to improve educational achievement and post-school outcomes.

**“While intrapersonal and interpersonal skills are most valued by employers, a large percentage of young adults lack these skills”.**



The post-secondary success project began in the 2014-2015 school year to address college and career competencies necessary for transition. The National Research Council (2012) identified intrapersonal, interpersonal and cognitive skills as vital to success in the 21st century, but many of these critical skills are not systematically taught in high school. While intrapersonal and interpersonal skills are most valued by employers, a large percentage of young adults lack these skills (National Association of Colleges and Employers, 2014). Collaboration across school roles is necessary to equip all students with competencies that will ensure their success in later life.

The post-secondary success project provides training to interdisciplinary high school teams across the state of Missouri in an effort to improve educational achievement and post-school outcomes. Teams receive instruction in the College and Career Competencies Framework (CCC Framework), and create plans which allow them to implement supports and instruction for intrapersonal and interpersonal competencies that have been shown to have positive impacts on educational achievement, attendance, engagement, study habits, physical and mental wellness, educational attainment and employment (Farrington, et al., 2012; National Research Council, 2012.)
