## Data Sources and Notes

Each System Point of Entry (SPOE) region is monitored every other year. SPOEs monitored for indicators 1, 7 and 8 for 2013-14 were 4, 5, 7, 8 and 10. All other SPOEs will show "N/A" on these indicators

### Indicator 1: Timely Provision of Services

Data Source: Compliance Monitoring reports

Timely Service data come from the 2013-14 DESE Compliance Monitoring reports.

### Indicator 2: Services in Natural Environments

Data Source: First Steps database

The primary setting for services is determined by the IFSP team. These data include all infants and toddlers with an IFSP on December 1, 2013.

### Indicator 3: Early Childhood Outcomes (ECO)

Data Source: First Steps database

Entry and exit ratings were used to determine the child's "outcome" in each of the three areas. Children who were in First Steps less than six months were not included in the data.

### Indicator 4: Family Involvement

Data Source: First Steps Family Survey, May 2014

Surveys were sent to all families with IFSPs in May 2014. Statewide response rate for the 2014 Family Survey: **22%**.

*Indicator 4A:* Averages the responses for two questions: "I received information and explanations about our family's rights to file a child complaint" and "I received information and explanations about our parental rights."

*Indicator 4B:* Averages the responses for two questions: "We are able to find and use the services and programs available to us." and "We know who to contact and what to do when we have questions or concerns."

*Indicator 4C:* Reports responses to the following question: "First Steps services give my family the tools to directly improve my child's development."

### Indicators 5 and 6: 1) Child Find Birth to One and 2) Child Find Birth to Three

Data Source: First Steps database

Data include all infants and toddlers with an IFSP on December 1, 2013. Census data is 2013 estimated population from the Missouri Census Data Center. ([http://mcdc.missouri.edu/websas/estimates\\_by\\_age.shtml](http://mcdc.missouri.edu/websas/estimates_by_age.shtml))

### Indicator 7: 45-Day Timeline

Data Source: Compliance Monitoring reports

Acceptable timelines included children whose initial IFSP meeting was held within 45 days of referral and children whose timeline exceeded 45 days due to parent/child-initiated delays. 45-day data come from the 2013-14 DESE Compliance Monitoring reports.

### Indicator 8: Early Childhood Transition

Data Source: Compliance Monitoring reports (A, B, and C)

Data for Indicators 8A, 8B and 8C come from 2013-14 DESE Compliance Monitoring reports.

### Indicator 9: Resolution Sessions

Data Source: Part C dispute resolution system database

This indicator is not applicable as Missouri did not adopt Part B due process procedures for Part C.

No due process hearing requests were received during 2013-14; therefore, this indicator is not listed for any SPOE region.

### Indicator 10: Mediation

Data Source: Part C dispute resolution system database
