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Introduction

On March 27, 2020, President Trump signed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, also known as the CARES Act, into law. The CARES Act is a \$2 trillion relief package to address the economic fallout related to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

This guidance is intended to be a summary of the education-related provisions of the CARES Act, including the Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) Fund under the Education Stabilization Fund, as it relates to COVID-19 transportation costs.

The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) wishes to express our thanks to Governor Mike Parson and his staff for recognizing the importance of providing local education agencies (LEAs) with funds to support student transportation costs related to COVID-19.

Transportation Supplement Grant

The purpose of the Transportation Supplement Grant of \$15,000,000 is to address increased student transportation costs related to COVID-19.

- Allowable expenses obligated from July 1, 2020 – September 30, 2021, include the following for additional transportation costs related to COVID-19:
 - Salary and benefits for drivers;
 - Salary and benefits for aides;
 - School buses;
 - Supplies such as fuel purchases;
 - Medical and cleaning supplies such as personal protective equipment and school bus sanitation equipment; or
 - Other COVID-19-related equipment.
- Payments for services not rendered are non-allowable expenses.
- LEAs may only claim reimbursement after expenses are incurred.
- Funds must be obligated from July 1, 2020 – September 30, 2021.
- Reimbursement must be claimed by September 30, 2022.
- Funding source is the GEER Fund.
- Equitable Services applies to this Transportation Supplement Grant.

Equitable Services Under the CARES Act

Section 18005 of the Act (P.L. 116-136 [March 27, 2020]) provides that LEAs receiving funds from Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) and/or GEER funds must provide equitable services to nonpublic schools as required under Section 1117 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). However, control of these funds and title to materials, equipment and property purchased with such funds must remain with the public school district and be administered by the public

school district. Public school districts must consult with nonpublic school officials within the districts to determine how the services will be provided to the nonpublic schools.

Transportation Supplement allocations made to public LEAs through GEER funds are subject to equitable services requirements. Equitable share calculations, Affirmation of Consultation forms and additional guidance on equitable services can be found on the DESE CARES Act webpage. If an LEA has already submitted Affirmation of Consultation forms from previous ESSER grants, no new forms are required. Districts must still consult regarding any new allocation. New consultation forms not submitted for the ESSER application must be completed and sent to the Federal Programs Section. The public LEA should contact ESEA Finance to determine the new dollar per student ratio so a recalculation of funds can be determined.

Allowable Activities for Equitable Services

Equitable services for nonpublic schools are required, and consultation with nonpublic schools is required. Services should be based on the needs of the nonpublic school and the 11 allowable uses listed below. This guidance is quoted from the ESSER Certification and Agreement.

Allowable Uses for Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) Fund and the Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) Fund as a part of Equitable Services:

1. Any activity authorized by the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965, including the following:
 - The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 USC 1400, et seq.) (IDEA)
 - The Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (34 USC 463, et seq.)
 - The Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006 (20 USC 2301, et seq.) (the Perkins Act)
 - Subtitle 8 of Title VII of the McKinney Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 USC 11431, et seq.);
2. Coordinating preparedness and response efforts of LEAs with state and local public health departments, and other relevant agencies, to improve coordinated responses among such entities to prevent, prepare for and respond to the coronavirus;
3. Providing principals and other school leaders with the resources necessary to address the needs of their individual schools;
4. Addressing the unique needs of low-income children or students, children with disabilities, English learners, racial and ethnic minorities, students experiencing homelessness, and foster care youth, through activities that include how outreach and service delivery will meet the needs of each population;
5. Developing and implementing procedures and systems to improve the preparedness and response efforts of LEAs;
6. Providing training and professional development for staff of the LEA on sanitation and minimizing the spread of infectious diseases;

7. Purchasing supplies to sanitize and clean LEA facilities, including buildings operated by such agency;
8. Planning for and coordinating during long-term closures, including:
 - How to provide meals to eligible students
 - How to provide technology for online learning to all students
 - How to provide guidance for carrying out requirements under IDEA
 - How to ensure other educational services can continue to be provided consistent with all federal, state and local requirements;
9. Purchasing educational technology (including hardware, software and connectivity) for students who are served by the LEA that aids in regular and substantive educational interaction between students and their classroom instructors, including low-income students and students with disabilities, which may include assistive technology or adaptive equipment;
10. Providing mental health services and supports;
11. Planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and supplemental afterschool programs, including providing classroom instruction or online learning during the summer months, and addressing the needs of low-income students, students with disabilities, English learners, migrant students, students experiencing homelessness and children in foster care.

Application Process for LEAs

To receive funds under the Transportation Supplement Grant, LEAs must complete the Application and Assurance for Funds Received under the CARES Act – ESSER Fund in Tiered Monitoring. The LEA must also complete the Affirmation of Consultation with Nonpublic School Officials for CARES Act for each eligible nonpublic school within district boundaries and upload each form into Tiered Monitoring. A blank nonpublic form can be found on the [DESE CARES Act webpage](#). Previously completed Assurances and Consultation Affirmations for ESSER funds apply to the Transportation Supplement Grant and do not need to be duplicated.

The Transportation Supplement Budget Application, Payment Requests and Final Expenditures Report will be completed within the ePeGs system under Quality Schools by September 30, 2022. The LEA's finance contact must have ePeGs CARES Transportation Supplement access.

Assurances

The list of assurances required for the Transportation Supplement Grant include the following:

I acknowledge and agree that the failure to comply with all assurances and certifications in this agreement, all relevant provisions and requirements of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act or CARES Act, P. L. 116-136 (March 27, 2020), or any other applicable law or regulation may result in liability under the False Claims Act, 31 USC § 3729, et seq.; OMB Guidelines to Agencies on Government-wide Debarment and Suspension (Non-procurement) in 2 CFR part 180, as adopted and amended as regulations of the U. S. Department of Education in 2 CFR part 3485; and 18 USC § 1001, as appropriate.

1. The LEA will accept funds in accordance with applicable federal and state statutes, regulations and applications, and the program will be administered in compliance with all provisions of such statutes, regulations, applications, policies and amendments thereto.
2. The LEA assures that it will comply with all assurances and certifications that were agreed to in the ***APPLICATION AND ASSURANCE FOR FUNDS RECEIVED UNDER THE CARES ACT, ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL EMERGENCY RELIEF (ESSER) FUND***. The LEA must have an approved ESSER Fund application and assurance filed with DESE to access the Transportation Supplement funds.
3. The LEA assures that it will comply with all applicable provisions of the Cash Management Improvement Act (CMIA) of 1990.
4. The LEA assures that the applied for funds are a reimbursement for student transportation costs obligated from July 1, 2020 - September 30, 2021, related to COVID-19 including additional

drivers, aides, school buses and supplies, such as additional fuel purchases, personal protective equipment, school bus sanitation equipment, medical and cleaning supplies, and additional equipment.

5. The LEA assures that Equitable Services have been provided.
6. The LEA assures that no other funding sources have reimbursed the LEA for these expenses.
7. The LEA assures that claimed expenses have been coded to Expenditure Function Code 2558 – Non-Allowable Transportation and Function Code 3711 – Non-Public Services.
8. The LEA assures that no non-transportation COVID-19 related salaries or expenses have been claimed.
9. The LEA assures that reimbursement is not being claimed for services not rendered.

Cash Management Improvement Act

The Cash Management Improvement Act (CMIA) was created to prevent interest earnings on Federal funds. Section 31 CFR part 205 “Rules and Procedures for Efficient Federal-State Funds Transfers,” states that methods and procedures for payment must minimize the time elapsing between the transfer of funds from the United States Treasury to the state, and ultimately, to the pass-through entity. Therefore, DESE must ensure that payments to the pass-through entity are for reimbursements only. DESE must monitor payments to assure that they conform to the federal regulations.

Payment Process for LEAs

Funds received under the Transportation Supplement Grant must be reimbursements for expenditures. LEAs must submit payment requests and a Final Expenditure Report through ePeGs. Funds received from DESE must be reimbursements for funds already expended. All Affirmation of Consultation with Nonpublic School Officials for CARES Act forms must be signed and uploaded into the Tiered Monitoring System under the CARES Act – Application and Assurance for ESSER Funds to receive a final payment.

LEA Reporting Requirements

The CARES Act requires the state to report spending quarterly. LEAs receiving funds under the Transportation Supplement Grant must report the amount received under each category of the grant budget. More specific information will be required for any equipment purchased with the grant. The U.S. Department of Education may impose additional reporting requirements. More information about these requirements will be provided as needed.

Documentation of Expenditures

LEAs will be required to keep documentation of expenditures (receipts, purchase orders, etc.) for monitoring purposes and code expenses reimbursed by this grant to the appropriate revenue and project code.
